Project Description*	Traditional sampan used to be a fishing tool for
	Tai O fishermen. It was an indispensable means
	of transportation for residents. Sampans also
	play an important role in traditional events such
	as weddings and funerals, Dragon Boat Festival
	parades. When Tai O's fishery declined, the
	importance of sampans has gradually faded. In
	80s, residents connected their Pang Uks
	together in response to fire safety
	requirements. They no longer rely on sampans to reach the shore. During the epidemic, Tai O
	once again became a popular tourist hotspot.
	Riding a traditional sampan and enjoying the
	coastal scenery is one of the favorites of visiting
	Tai O. This made the "traditional sampan" a
	cultural symbol of Tai O. Tai O sampans not only
	represent the fishermen life, but also serve as a
	"bridge" leading the public to understand the
	preservation of Tai O. This project aims to design
	and produce a set of educational materials to
	introduce Tai O traditional sampan and rowing
	scull (傳統舢舨和搖櫓文化), which can be used
	in themed exhibitions, seminars, face-to-face
	and online classes. Engagement projects to
	revitalize the skill of rowing scull through
	workshops, interactive dramas and rowing
	experience tours will be organized so to inspire
	primary and secondary school students about
	this local tradition.
